## KINHAVEN TRUSTEES ANNOUNCE MAJOR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



### THE CAMPAIGN FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

The true Kinhaven spirit, as you know, is a timeless one. Unfortunately, the facilities on our grounds are not. Over the past few years the natural decay of our buildings has become all too evident and we have been working hard to find ways to support the integrity, safety and functionality of our 31-acre campus.

The effort to renew and enhance our grounds is already underway. We have already raised nearly \$1 million! Over the past three years, we have built two new cabins on the Hill, four on the Knoll and three new faculty cabins near the dining hall. Also, the kitchen has been upgraded, and the stone walkway to the concert hall, a central part of our campus, has been rebuilt.

Proud as we are of these accomplishments, there is still more work to be done. Right now, we need your support to complete two sets of student cabins and bathhouses and two faculty cabins. Your donation will also enable us to upgrade our kitchen and dining facilities, and improve rehearsal space.

We need the financial support of every member of the Kinhaven family to reach our ambitious goal. We are a small community but our hearts and our dreams are big. It is crucial that each of us takes responsibility for rebuilding Kinhaven – our community depends on it.



### A SIGNIFICANT GIFT FROM THE ORTON FAMILY

We are delighted to announce a \$200,000 capital campaign gift from Lyman Orton, given in honor of his mother, Mildred Ellen Orton. Both mother and son are alumni of Kinhaven. For many years, Mildred Ellen participated in the Adult Chamber Workshop.

Lyman Orton and his three sons, Gardner, Cabot and Eliot, own and run The Vermont Country Store, the famous "purveyors of the practical and hard to find." The family business was founded in 1945 by Lyman's parents, Mildred Ellen and Vrest, as the first restored rural general store in the nation. The loyalty, compassion and old-fashioned values of this family are strongholds of the Vermont community and Kinhaven alumni. The success of their business is clearly testament to the good sense and strong community values this family holds so dear.

Lyman clearly learned well from his mother. In addition to taking over and expanding the family business, and running it with the help of his three sons, Lyman co-founded the Orton Foundation whose mission includes helping small cities and towns to "articulate, implement, and steward their Heart & Soul," or the elements that are central to the identity of a place.

This generous gift from the Orton family is testament to the legacy of this important Vermont family.
